# MEGAN TWOHEY Wednesday, September 28, 2022

Megan Twohey is a Pulitzer Prize-winning investigative reporter for *The New York Times* and co-author of the bestselling book, *She Said: Breaking The Sexual Harassment Story That Helped Ignite a Movement*. The book takes readers behind the scenes of Twohey and Jodi Kantor's 2017 investigation of Harvey Weinstein, which helped trigger the global reckoning on sexual misconduct. The investigation shared in the 2018 Pulitzer Prize for Public Service as well as the George Polk award for national reporting and won many other prizes.

Twohey has focused much of her reporting on the treatment of women and children. She uncovered an underground network where parents gave away adopted children they no longer wanted to strangers met on the Internet in a practice known as re-homing. The series, "The Child Exchange," showed how this dangerous black market took place with no government oversight and at great risk to children, and was a finalist for the 2014 Pulitzer Prize for Investigative Reporting.

Twohey also was one of the first journalists to expose how police and prosecutors were shelving DNA evidence collected after sex crimes, robbing victims of the chance for justice. In response to her stories, Illinois passed the first state law mandating the testing of every rape kit.

Also! *She Said* has recently been turned into an American biographical drama produced by Brad Pitt. The film stars Carey Mulligan and Zoe Kazan as Twohey and Kantor, and is scheduled to be released on November 18, 2022.

Additionally, just this past month, Twohey and Kantor were recognized by *Fast Company* magazine amongst its list of the most creative people in business for training the next generation of reporters.

Derreck Kayongo is the founder of the Global Soap Project, a humanitarian aid organization that collects discarded and unused soap from thousands of hotels worldwide, reprocesses it, then distributes it to in-need populations around the world. The project was born from his simple observation about how much soap is available in hotels, and how much is thrown away. This simple observation became an innovative idea now battling global health issues in 90 countries. Hygiene-related diseases, and the resulting deaths, have dissipated in many at-risk communities, thanks in part to Kayongo's creative problem solving. From Ugandan refugee to successful entrepreneur, CEO and renowned human rights activist, Kayongo's journey inspires audiences to dream big.

### Sarah Thomas Wednesday, March 22, 2023

Sarah Thomas changed the game in the world's most quintessential maledominated sport - football - when she became the first female NFL official, officiating her first game on September 13, 2015 between the Kansas City Chiefs and Houston Texans - and on February 7, 2021 when she became the first female to officiate a Super Bowl. Named one of *Sports Illustrated 100* most influential figures of all time, Sarah is no stranger to being the first or breaking gender barriers. Since joining the NFL's roster of officials, she has become a trail-blazing inspiration to women everywhere, embodying the notion that with a belief in self, inner drive, hard work, preparation and a mindset of being the best you can be, no barrier or ceiling is impenetrable.

## Captain Scott Kelly Wednesday, April 26, 2023

Former NASA astronaut and retired U.S. Navy Captain Scott Kelly shares the remarkable story of his "Year in Space" mission. He holds the record for the single longest mission of an American astronaut in space; previously he held the record for the total accumulated number of days spent in space. When he and his twin brother Mark were selected to become astronaut candidates in April 1996, they were the first relatives ever selected. After completing his training, Scott became the first American in his class of 44 prospective astronauts assigned to a space flight as the pilot of STS-103, an emergency repair mission to the Hubble Space Telescope. On his second mission, Kelly was assigned to command space shuttle mission STS-118, a rare feat given that most shuttle commanders are assigned after two flights as a pilot. He describes the effects of isolation, the physical impact on the body and the psychological pressures of living in a confined space, as well as the many dangers. Chief among the lessons Scott shares: the importance of preparation, attention to detail and teamwork-any of which can mean the difference between life and death, or success and failure for a team.


